

### 2-1-1 Connects

2-1-1 continues to be a vital United Way program and an important resource to our community at-large again in 2023. Our call center partners across the state were as busy as ever taking calls and assisting with resources for emergency and every day needs.

In 2023, almost 1,200 calls were made to 2-1-1 from our area.



Callers were seeking assistance with utilities/energy assistance, housing, food, and disaster services. This statewide service is fully funded in partnership with all the United Ways in Alabama to provide emergency assistance and non-emergency referrals. The 2-1-1 system proved to be vital in 2023 by helping coordinate resources and organizations following several disasters early in the year.

2-1-1 serves individuals from all walks of life and is available 24/7/365 by calling, chatting or texting to 2-1-1 or 1-888-421-1266. Translators are available if needed.

### **2023 was BUSY!**

2023 was quite the year for our United Way and BUSY is an understatement!

DISASTER RESPONSE AND RECOVERY was a defining feature of 2023 for us. It started with tornadoes on January 12 which caused major damage and loss of property in both Coosa and Tallapoosa counties. This was followed a couple short months later by a massive hail storm on March 25 in the town of Camp Hill, demolishing almost every car in the small town of 1,000 people and affecting 80% of the homes/roofs in the area. Then sadly on April 15, we experienced what no one ever should, a mass shooting in Dadeville leaving 4 lives lost and many more injured. It has been a long, hard road of recovery for each of these events.



Long Term Recovery Committees (LTRCs) were set up in both Coosa and Tallapoosa counties raising over \$55,000 for the recovery efforts. Donations were received from individuals, corporations, fundraisers, along with grants from the United Church of Christ, Enbridge, Alabama Power, other area churches, Hometown Organizing Project, Faith Chapel Christian Center and others. Designated funds by county or incident have been closely monitored and used as directed. These LTRCs have been working with case management to help the survivors of the tornadoes and hail storms recover. To date, 8 individuals and/or families have been helped with several more to come. The Caring for Dadeville Committee was formed, with our United Way as a member. This committee met regularly working to disburse all funds collected to help support the medical, funeral, and other expenses for the shooting survivors and victim's families.



DAY OF ACTION - Because 1 Day of Action wasn't enough, we held 2 Day of Action events again in 2023! First we were at Benjamin Russell High School and Reeltown High School on June 23 where 85 volunteers came out to help clean, paint, landscape, and beautify the schools on a very hot June morning. A special thank you to our sponsors for this event: The Home Depot Alex City, Russell Do-It Center, Alabama Paper & Supply, and Sherwin Williams.

Next up on **July 14**, **we headed to Central Elementary in Coosa County where 75 volunteers** put in a lot of sweat equity on a humid July morning to clean, landscape, clean up the elementary playground, pressure wash and much more. A special thank you to our sponsors: Commissioner Brandon Davis, Alabama Paper & Supply, Russell Do-It Center, Home Depot Alex City, and First Bank.

Thank you to everyone who helped make Day of Action (x2) a huge success!!!

FUNDRAISERS 2023! We were excited to host our 5th annual Lake Martin Wedding & Event Expo in February raising over \$2,500! Also in February, the Lake Martin Dadeville Chamber hosted a Valentine's Charity Ball raising \$10,000 for our United Way!

The **Fashion Show & Silent Auction** was held in October, **raising another \$7,500** thanks to the over 150 attendees, 13 VIP tables, 2 local stores modeling and 58 silent auction items!
